- We had several players play with Rush Select, an all-star team made up of players from Rush clubs around the world
- We hosted the largest tournament in Alaska, the Alaska Airlines Cup, hosting almost 90 teams this year
- Our Juneau branch hosted a camp for over 100 players that was led by coaches from Alaska Rush, Colorado Rush and Georgia Rush
- Our 07B and 07G attended the Rush Fest in July in Colorado Springs, CO, an event with 50 teams and 800 players from all around the country
- Our Technical Director, Brian Lux, attended and completed the USSF Grassroots Instructor Licensing Course, Brian was also named the Director of the Alaska Development Program
- We had several of our staff in the ADP program, Lauren Meehan, Mike Montgomery, Dan Rufner, Chris Hoke and Matt Dusenberry
- More than 40 of our players were invited to join ADP teams for various trips throughout the cycle as well
- Our College Advisory Program hosted a meeting with National CAP Director Josh Tyler (Missouri Rush) during the AAC and added College Fit Finder as a complimentary program for any of our registered players
- Hosted a College ID Camp with over 60 players and 11 college coaches, including Mike Piserchio from the University of Alabama (D1)

TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ '02/'03 Boys We entered 2 teams into most tournaments and Leagues. We finished 1st in UAYSL outdoor season, 3rd & 4th in the High School Division at AAC, 1st & 4th in Far North. The 02/03 Boys attended President's Cup in Noro, CA. They finished 4-0-1 and scored 14 goals by 6 different players and advanced to the semi-finals. They lost 5-2 in the semis to a SC Elite Nevada the team that went on to win the President's Cup. The 03 boys will be traveling to Boise ID to attend Far West Regional Championships in June 2020.
- ➤ '04 Boys –Entered 2 teams into the UAYSL High School Division and they finished 5th. They finished 5th in AAC, 5th in Far North, and 3rd in State Cup. This team received a Team Fair Play Award at State Cup for exceptional Sportsmanship.

- ➤ '05 Boys Finished 1st in UAYSL, 1st in AAC, 3rd in the '04 Division in Far North, and 2nd at State Cup.
- ➤ '06 Boys Finished 3rd in UAYSL, 5th in AAC, 3rd in Far North, and 5th in State Cup but they missed advancing to the semis by 1 point.
- ➤ '07 Boys Just added a handful of new players from our recreational league and improved throughout the season by finishing in the middle of the pack in a 9-team division in AAC, 5th out of 6 in Far North, and 4th in their division in State Cup. This team received a Team Fair Play Award at State Cup for exceptional Sportsmanship.
- ➤ '07 Girls Just added a handful of new players from our recreational league and improved throughout the season by finishing 4th in AAC, 4th in Far North, and 5th in State Cup.
- ➤ '08 Boys Have been together and developing for a few years and are a very strong team. They finished 3rd in UAYSL, 1st in AAC, 1st in Far North, and they were a State Cup Finalist in 2019.
- ➤ '08 Girls We have added several new players to this group, and they are becoming a strong team. This team finished 5th in UAYSL, played in AAC with the 07 girls, finished 5th in Far North and they were a State Cup Finalist in 2019.
- ➤ '09 Boys We have added several new players to this group, and they continue to grow and learn the game as they participate in UAYSL, AAC and Far North.
- ➤ '10/'11 Boys This is a newly formed team with using players from our recreational league. Scores are not posted, and placement is not kept per USYS player Development Initiative. But they participated in UAYSL, AAC, and Far North.

CLUB HIGHLIGHTS

- AYSC hosted the 5th Annual FootGolf Classic at Fox Hollow Golf Course, we had over 60 players enter, and we had youth & adult divisions playing a scramble format. We used profits from this event to donate to the Nelson Family to help with medical expenses as Nic battles cancer.
- AYSC hosted the **33rd Annual Far North Invitational Tournament** at Kincaid Park. This year AYSC had over 60 teams with teams coming to Anchorage from Yukon We had some food trucks participate and tournament sponsors were GCI, The Dome, Anchorage Fracture & Orthopedic Clinic, Aldrich, Tastee Freez, CREA, AS&G, AK Executive Search, Airglas Inc, & Northern Smiles Orthodontics...Far North **2020 will take place at Kincaid July 9th-12th.**
- AYSC hosted the **5thth Annual Sterling Camp** right after Far North. We had over 75 players attend the camp. We brought up 5 coaches to work the camp. Players were exposed to Division I, II, & III College Coaches.
- AYSC is on the 7th year running an in-house Recreational League offering age groups U5 U16. We are offering recreational soccer year-round with 4 different seasons (Fall, Winter, Spring, & Summer). We have recreational Futsal seasons in the fall & spring at O'Malley Sports Center and indoor rec soccer at Fox Hollow in January. We had over 110 players this summer and several players that transitioned from our rec program to our competitive teams.
- AYSC offered a **Preschool Academy**, 2.5-5-year-old classes, March through October and had over 150 future AYSC soccer stars participating. We will begin our Preschool Academy again in the winter and offer classes through next fall.

- AYSC offered our 9th year of TOPSoccer with our TOPSoccer Director, Megan Coleman. We had over 40 players registered for our winter and summer classes. Megan is an Occupational Therapist at Kincaid Elementary and she is very passionate about TOPSoccer and hopes it keeps growing across the State.
- ➤ We have added over **40 players** onto AYSC teams.
- ➤ We added **5 new coaches** onto our coaching staff.
- ➤ AYSC had over **46 players selected for Alaska Development Program** with several selected to travel to ODP events and represent Alaska.
- ➤ AYSC started working with the CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) to provide scholarships and the opportunity to play soccer to kids in foster care. We have already awarded scholarships to 6 kids to play recreational soccer this fall and plan to grow our relationship with CASA.
- AYSC still has a good relationship with the Refugee Assistance Immigration Services although RAIS programs have been adjusted in 2018 due to resources. AYSC still provides scholarships for 1 refugee player to participate in year-round competitive soccer.
- > AYSC awarded over \$12,000 in scholarships to AYSC players in need.
- ➤ We had 3 teams receive a Team Fair Play Award in the 2019 State Cup Tournament.
- ➤ We had 41 players honored on All State Teams in the 2019 State Cup Tournament.

We appreciate all the commitment and involvement from our members, and we are looking forward to seeing what 2020 brings AYSC and the State of Alaska.

Supplemental Training

The CISC Supplemental Training's are offered twice a week through the Fall, Winter & Spring. These training sessions are open to all competitive and pre-competitive age groups within the club at no extra cost.

Individual Skill Development will focus on the individual players skill on the ball. This includes ball manipulation, passing & receiving, crossing, volleys/headers, striking, and more.

Also offered within Supplemental Training is Injury Prevention & Fitness. This is an

opportunity for players to develop good running habits and hit their highest fitness point. This program can be geared towards the oldest players or youngest in the club. Offering age specific work outs and injury prevention plans.

College Advisory Program

Competitive Players within Cook Inlet S.C. have the opportunity to utilize the CISC College Advisory Program. This opportunity will help our competitive players decide on which program level or specific schools they would like to attend.

AYSA Report

The Eclipse Club continues its strategic focus on comprehensive player development. This season, Eclipse has grown by adding U9 teams to the mix. We have built a system whereby U9s and U10s comprise a "Grassroots Academy" and play 7-a-side competitions on a smaller field and the U11s and U12s comprise an "Advanced Academy" and play 9-a-side on a medium sized field. The U13s and older play and train as single birth year teams on 11-a-side full-sized pitches. The Club has experienced steady growth over the past year with over 325 at tryouts and approximately 290 players rostered on teams. We are sporting an all time record number of teams and a record number of member/players in the club. Eclipse is currently fielding 18 competitive teams made up of players born from 2013 through 2003. This is the first time in many years we have a team in every age group for both genders—U9 through U18. We are focusing like a laser beam on our youngest ages with the formation of a *Grassroots* and *Advanced Academies*. While maintaining pure age team competitions in the summers, these academies will emphasize age-appropriate skill development and will train some in multi-age or co-ed settings. David Powers, our Technical Director, is the overarching director of both these academies. We are encouraging Coach Powers and the lead coaches in these academies to innovate and pull out all the creative stops in finding ways to develop our youngest players!

Coaching Staff

Our coaching ranks have grown and developed over the past two years. We have a fantastic dedicated group of coaches working hard to help our players develop. First, the club-wide coaching leadership staff includes myself as Director of Coaching, David Powers as Technical Director, and Reed Thomas as Club-wide Keeper Trainer. Our group of strong head coaches (and assistant coaches) are passionate, well-trained, and well-respected by their colleagues across the state. On staff we currently have: Howard Maxwell, David Powers, Charlie Parr, Reed Thomas, Danny Dominick, Damon Crutcher, Shannon Staiger, John Mayer, Peter Shurr, Fabio Mariutto, and Kenny Hoop. We have a very strong group of assistant coaches as well, all working hard to help our players improve. They are also working to develop their skills as coaches. Many of our coaches have pursued coaching education and professional development this past year and several have emerged with new advanced coaching licenses. We are very lucky to have this stable of highly qualified, dedicated coaches working to make our players and our teams better every day! I know parents and club-mates alike are excited to watch as this staff of coaches work their magic in 2020, and as they take their teams to new heights and develop players' technical skills along the way.

June Team Camp

Our annual team camp held in June at the FYSA complex was a great success once again. We had 8 strong high-level club and college coaches come in and work our teams and our keepers with great enthusiasm and success. Several of the coaches had direct collegiate coaching experience and ties. Together they coached a boys and girls showcase game one evening, showcasing our high school aged players. In speaking with our players, our parents and our coaches about the camp, the feedback was very positive.

College Players

We currently have numerous alumni club players on college teams throughout the country and we have some current club players who have nearly cemented their specific plans and locations to play collegiate

soccer next year! Stay-tuned for a showcase list of Eclipse alumni players playing college soccer on our club web page and on our Facebook page soon. We anticipate implementing several other new initiatives directed at helping our athletes find places to play the game they love after high school!

Pre-Academy

In addition to our 290+ current members, we are building a group of young boys and girls who will participate in our soccer *Pre-Academy*. These players in pre-comp ages U9 and younger will focus on fun foot skills and building passion for the game. Our pre-academy is currently run by our Technical Director, Coach David Powers. This Pre-Academy will start in January and run on selected Monday or Tuesday nights at Tanana Middle School. Reports are that we have a fantastic group of enthusiastic young players who are eager to sign up. Stay tuned and pass the word. Please feel free to help recruit and promote players into our academy program and into our club. These players are our future!

Special Programs

In addition to our academy style training and our regular team training environments, we have also provided our members access to several key supplemental training programs throughout the year. These have been well received and include: *Mastery Mondays and Technical Tuesdays*, both programs designed to promote foot skill development; *Strikers and Finishing Sessions*, designed to improve our players technical skills and tactical decision making in the attacking third; *S.O.P.* (speed of play), sessions offered as supplemental co-ed training for our high school aged players; and *Jumpstart Boot Camp*: offered in late May to facilitate strength, conditioning, agility, and balance moving into the outdoor season; and, we are also actively looking to set up a venue to provide dynamic strength & conditioning sessions for our older players.

Future

The future of the Eclipse Soccer Club is very bright indeed. Our relationship with FYSA and the Executive Director, Colt Chase, has never been better. The Club has office space in the FYSA offices and our two-way communication has improved dramatically since the hire of Colt five years ago. The quality and durability of our great field complex is in no small part linked to the FYSA leadership and membership. We enjoy working with the recreational base of players in Fairbanks and we anticipate exploring numerous opportunities for partnerships with FYSA and the Fairbanks soccer community going forward.

We were very honored to host the 2018 AYSA Annual General Meeting in Homer last November. It was a great opportunity for other clubs in Alaska to experience the beauty of Homer. We were very proud to have two competitive co-ed teams participate in the Zane Cup in June and the Far North Tournament in July in Anchorage. Our U10/U9 & U11 youth show a lot of promise for the growth of Homer soccer.

JSC accomplishments during the 2018-2019 season.

- The club had 333 registered players participate during the 2018-2019 season.
- Two competitive teams traveled to tournaments competing in the Alaska Airlines tournament.
- JSC traveled to the annual Whitehorse Exchange during in April 2019 Spring. A total of eight teams and sixty players.
- Two annual 3v3 World Cup tournaments were held this past season; fall of 2018 and spring of 2019. The fall tournament had a total of 118 players that consisted of twelve non-JSC. The spring tournament included 100 JSC and six non-JSC players.
- In December the Holiday Cup is a popular Juneau tournament for all age groups that guarantees teams at least five games. While we don't run Holiday Cup, we offer quite a bit of support organizing all teams for two of the divisions (Elementary and Middle School). We also help provide some financial support through a grant we receive. Great to be involved in an event that is completely free for players from 9-35+, has over 400 players, and close to 90 games played over the Holiday Break.
- Contracted by the City and Borough of Juneau to provide youth soccer camps for the municipality totaling 188 participants. Two camps were offered; Wee Camp 65, and Advanced Camp at 123 participants.
- The club had a total of twelve attendees at the Youth Referee Development clinics.
- JSC hosted a RUSH Soccer Camp during summer 2019 with four coaches from various locations. A total of eighty players attended the camp.

Without indoor facilities and due to the low population in the area most athletes play different winter sports there isn't usually many athletes that are available to play any kind of soccer in the winter, so this is very exciting, and we expect more Futsal teams next Fall.

It is encouraging to see many more athletes from KPSC want to be involved in ADP. Having a training down here both in the summer and fall is sure helpful to parents that are on the fence about the program.

Palmer Soccer Club offers a recreational soccer program in the Matanuska Valley area for u5-u19 that operates an indoor season in the spring and a summer outdoor season. PSC holds clinics during the spring indoor session along with a summer camp that is traditionally facilitated by an outside source. This year PSC partnered with Alaska City FC to hold a soccer camp. PSC continues to provide the opportunities to play soccer at a low cost to our membership. PSC is a 501(c)3 non-profit.

PSC underwent many changes in the 2018/2019 soccer season.

- We started the year with over a 50% turnover in board positions and the filling of vacant positions; a new board for the second year in a row.
- Introduction to Futsal program for indoor season for the second year. This was better received by our members than the previous year. They can see the benefits to playing futsal.
- Held skill clinics the duration of the indoor season, this benefited all players and noticeably helped the returning summer players.
- Public school gym rental space continues to be a challenge for our indoor soccer season with very limited gym space available and double booking.
- We had 86 amazing coach and volunteers this year. We could not have simply done it without them. Our volunteers are an asset to this club.
- Our player numbers were maintained from the previous year.
- Referee numbers continued to grow from the previous year.
- PSC received grants, primarily for overdue equipment upgrade in the previous year. This summer we were able to see this finally be completed by receiving new goals and bleachers on the field. This helps with the new field layout.
- PSC received a local donation from Marco T's Pizzeria who provided the shipping for our new goals. With this company's donation, PSC was able to maximize the grant goal order and get them delivered to the fields. Along with several local trucking companies who also donated their time and equipment. These donations made a huge impact for PSC and will continue to benefit our membership for many years. We are very grateful.
- PSC partnered with Alaska City FC and Oregon coaches for a weeklong soccer camp with the lead from our Program Director and Alaska City FC player, Josh Banks.
- PSC continues to help our community members through scholarships.
- PSC hosted several referee courses in in the spring that was instructed by Gregg Pralle.
- PSC appreciates the referee training courses being available in the Mat Su area. Gregg is a huge asset to the develop
 of referees in the Mat Su area and we appreciate being able to have local guidance and support.
- PSC attempted to host Grassroots coaching courses and a D license, but we did not get enough registered participates to hold. We will try again next in 2020. We appreciate having access to coach education instructors.
- Field maintenance was excellent again this year. Support from the City of Palmer and the Public Works Dept was exceptional. A huge thank you the staff at the City of Palmer.
- PSC participated in the training that AYSA provided to the club administrators.
- PSC Board President attended the TOPSoccer coaching clinic in August
- We will work towards brining more recreational soccer opportunities to our community in the next year.
